Russ Battey, Tom Nuhsbaumer, Pat O'Connor, and Steve Raebel were the other male royalty candidates. Susan Nuhsbaumer and Bill Crawford, 1970 king and queen, were on hand to crown their predecessors. Kathy Nuhsbaumer served as mistress of ceremonies and introduced all the royalty.

The band accompanied the proceedings and the chorus ensembles sang two numbers, "You Gotta Be a Football Hero" and "Raindrops Keep Fallin' on My Head." The cheerleaders led the RHS yell and coronation had ended for another year. Students and alumni then filed to the parking lot where the "R" was burned and a pep fest took place.

The Friday activities were kicked off with the parade through main street. Floats were con-

structed by all the classes of high school and junior high, most of the school organizations, and some of the Redfield business places. The Senior Class won the float competition with their version of "Puff the Magic Dragon."

Juniors were the runners-up with the "Yellow Submarine" and the sophomores received honorable mention on "These Boots Are Made for Walking." The FFA again took the organizational competition. They had a steamboat representing "Proud Mary." The theme this year was "Songs of the Century."

Dr. Verle Rogers, superintendent of Redfield schools, said he was well pleased with this year's event. He stated, "I was impressed with the cooperation, organization, and involvement of the students. Also, the overall quality of the floats was higher than in previous years. This may have been due to the increased allotment of money for each class to spend on their floats. This year's Homecoming was a great success, highlighted by the fine performance of the football players Friday night."



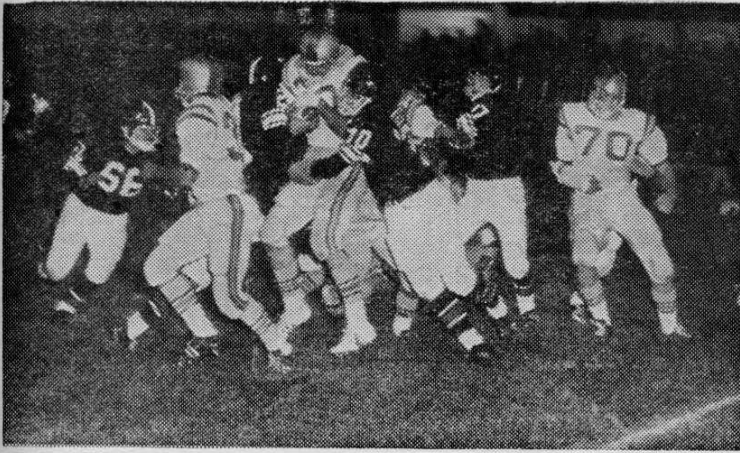
Senior Float Captures First Place

Gridders Win Tilt; Runners Take Dual

Pheasant footballers scored a 36-8 win over Sisseton in the Homecoming game at Redfield on September 24. Redfield is 2-0 in the conference and 2-2 for the season.

Bob Tiff started the scoring for Redfield when he crossed the goal line on a run midway through the first quarter. The Denis Guentner to Steve Raebel conversion pass was complete.

Redfield tallied another score in the second quarter on a 20-yard Guentner to Terry Kegler pass. The conversion attempt failed. Halftime saw the Pheasants leading by a score of 14-8.

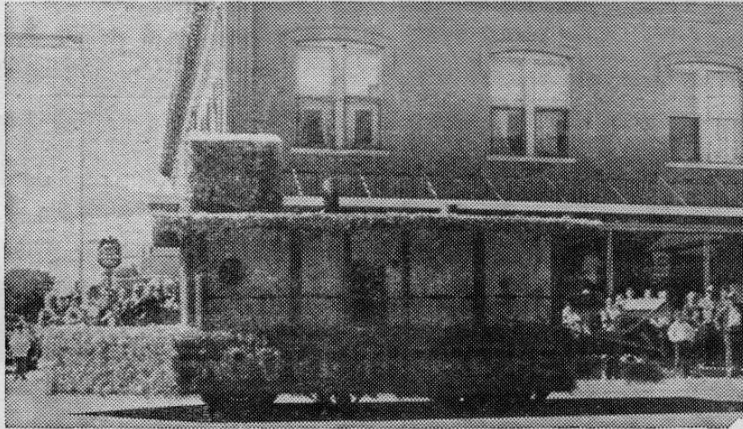
The second half saw Redfield scoring three more touchdowns as Sisseton was held scoreless. Bob Tiff scored on a short run, and the PAT pass from Guentner to Betten was successful. A 71-yard Guentner to Terry Kegler aerial accounted for another Redfield tally. Guentner again passed to Betten for the successful conversion. The Pheasants closed out the scoring with a 75-yard run from scrimmage by Dean Jankord.

The Pheasants amassed 444 total yards, more than doubling Sisseton's total, and quarterback Denis Guentner completed five of seven passes. Fumbles were a big factor in the win as Redfield recovered three Redmen fumbles. Coach Rollie Nielson cited the game as a very fine team effort by all members of the squad, highlighted by the running of Bob Tiff, signal calling of Denis Guentner, and the defensive play of linebacker Daryl Mullenberg.

CROSS COUNTRY

Redfield's cross country runners proved their strength against the Sisseton Redmen by defeating them 13-33 at the local cross country course. The dual meet was held on the evening of September 24.

Don Zundel led the RHS runners by placing first. He was followed by his brother Bob who took second. The other Pheasant runners scoring were Bob Severance, fourth place and David Hansen, fifth.
